

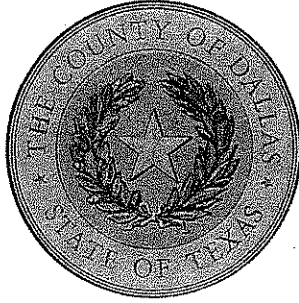
# Resolution

**BE IT REMEMBERED**, at a regular meeting of the Commissioners Court of Dallas County, Texas, held on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2014, on motion made by Dr. Theresa M. Daniel, Commissioner of District #1 and seconded by John Wiley Price, Commissioner of District #3, the following Resolution was adopted:

**WHEREAS**, The Dallas County Commissioner Court congratulates The University of North Texas - Dallas College of Law on becoming Texas' 10<sup>th</sup> law school, the third law school in Dallas-Fort Worth and the only public law school in Dallas County, and

**WHEREAS**, UNT Dallas College of Law welcomes its inaugural law school class in the Fall term of 2014 with its mission of five key goals: access, preparation, value, innovation, and community; and

**WHEREAS**, UNT Dallas College of Law provides access to a legal education for persons who have the potential to become excellent lawyers but might not otherwise be able to have such an education; and

**WHEREAS**, UNT Dallas College of Law serves as a vehicle for diversity in the legal profession by attracting students through a holistic admissions approach and maintaining an affordable tuition structure; and

**WHEREAS**, UNT Dallas College of Law distinguishes itself as part of the legal education movement that focuses on practice-related competencies and readiness to serve clients in the twenty-first century; and


**WHEREAS**, UNT Dallas College of Law provides legal training for talented students in the Dallas-Fort Worth area so that promising students may remain in Dallas and become contributing members of the Dallas County community; and


**WHEREAS**, UNT Dallas College of Law will partner with Dallas County to provide internship experiences in the public sector; and


