Nearly 70 million Takata airbag inflators, in approximately 42 million vehicles, are or will be under recall in the United States by 2018. Even a minor fender bender can cause these airbags to rupture, spraying metal shrapnel into drivers and passengers. More than 180 serious injuries have been reported, and two Texas drivers have died.

While the recall includes vehicles made by 19 automakers, hundreds of thousands of the Hondas and Acuras pictured below pose the most urgent threat - with up to a 50% chance of rupture upon deployment. These vehicles are unsafe to drive for any reason.
