**For Immediate Release: Man Who Goes on the Run on Day 4 of his Murder Trial  
Sentenced to 99 Years in Prison**

**(Dallas, Texas)** – A guilty verdict and a 99-year prison sentence was handed down to a 25-year-old man who was a no show on day 4 of his murder trial. As court was set to begin yesterday morning (Thursday, June 27, 2019), prosecutors learned the defendant, Rene Adrian Carrillo, cut off his electronic leg monitor on Wednesday night and took off.


The United States Marshal Service immediately issued a warrant and released a wanted poster for Carrillo. They have been on the hunt for him ever since. If anyone has seen Carrillo or has information about his whereabouts, please call **972-978-1765**.

On October 11, 2017, Dallas Police charged Carrillo with the murder of Jean Carlo Casiano-Torres. Witnesses reported that a friend of Carrillo's got into a verbal argument with Casiano-Torres inside Club XTC. The argument then continued outside into the parking lot. Video Surveillance later captured Carrillo pulling out a weapon and shooting Casiano-Torres multiple times, killing him. Lead Prosecutor Marissa Trevino told jurors, "Carrillo killed a man he had no beef with. A person he had never met. His actions show a lack of respect for life and an unwillingness to accept responsibility."

Assistant District Attorney Summer Elmazi added, "Although Carrillo decided to go on the run, it was important that he was held accountable. The jury did that today with their verdict." When Carrillo is re-captured he will begin serving his 99-year sentence in a Texas prison. He will also face additional felony charges for fleeing and bail jumping.
