



## Texas Court FAQ's

### 1. Is e-filing required to be in use to use this?

It is not required, but it is more convenient. This site can be used to generate legal documents that can be printed and filed in person with the local court.

### 2. How do my constituents gain access to this service?

Access is available through any internet access point (which can be provided by the court in their lobby). If the jurisdiction does not allow electronic document filing, this service allows required documents which can be printed and then filed with court.

### 6. Can courts create their own interviews and forms?

Since this is a statewide platform, only the Office of Court Administrators (OCA) and TLSC can author forms.

### 7. How do we know which clients are using Guide & File and at what volume?

### 8. What are the hardware/infrastructure requirements?

Chrome is the recommended browser due to speed and efficiency, but filers may also utilize IE 11 or above, Chrome, Safari, or Firefox.

### 9. What is the cost for Guide & File?

There is no cost to the court or the filer associated with this service. If the court decides that a kiosk will be set up, the court will need to supply a computer with Internet access. The OCA also provides free PCs to local courts to help with this access.

### 10. Do all courts in my county have to agree to use this service?

The state has deemed that Guide & File is a viable EFSP, therefore filers can choose to utilize the software. When integrating Guide & File with Odyssey®, Tyler integration resources are prioritized to counties that are integrating Guide & File for all courts, not just a subset of courts.

### 11. Is this service multi-lingual?

Multi-lingual content is not currently available in Texas.
